Description of your Intended Use of Funds & Itemized Budget:

The University of Washington School of Medicine accepted my wife Renee and I, their first Idaho married couple ever accepted, into the WWAMI regional medical education program this year. I intend to graduate from the University of Washington with an MD and a Masters in Public Health. \$500 will help pay for some of the necessary personal medical equipment first year of medical students require. I hope to initially purchase quality equipment for continued use in a community clinic, which I hope to open after medical school and residency.

Budget:

- \$400 - approximate cost of otoscope and ophthalmoscope set (with medical school group rate)
- \$100 - approximate cost of stethoscope
- any budget surplus would be used to help purchase books

Personal Statement:

With an MD/MPH, I will have more of the necessary tools to continue working with homeless and destitute populations, who often find the United States healthcare system difficult to access and understand. I believe access to healthcare should be made easier and more affordable for these poor populations, meaning I will need to find creative solutions to fund projects and will often make less money myself. In order to make these goals a reality more quickly, I will work hard through medical school and try to stretch any financial awards I am fortunate enough to receive as far as possible. I hope to open a community clinic in the University of Washington's WWAMI region as soon after completing residency as possible.
