In the position as Associate Vice President for Academic Affairs and Dean, I am responsible for the administration and launch of Florida Tech's partnership with Bisk Education, Inc. to provide both undergraduate and graduate degree programs. I have served as the point of contact between administrative and academic units at Florida Tech to the staff at Bisk.

I have oversight for the budget for the funds associated with launch. Working with the university budget office, I helped develop the business plan for the launch.

I have shepherded the programs through the respective curriculum committees to obtain faculty approval of the degrees.

Working with staff at Florida Tech and at a Bisk, we use a proven instructional design approach for course development. This design included the development of video lecturettes incorporated into a proprietary learning management system.

I also have worked with other units that provide online/distance learning program provided by Florida Tech. These programs are out of the University College, College of Engineering, and the College of Aeronautics. These programs utilize streaming video and Blackboard as the delivery media.

In my time as Dean, I served as a member of the library committee, ACITC (Academic Information Technology Committee), and ADITC (Administrative Information Technology Committee). I chaired the subcommittee that wrote the initial draft of the technology portion of the strategic plan.

In my role of professor of eEducation, I have overseen the state authorization efforts and the mLearning (mobile learning) task force working to establish a strategic plan for the implementation of mobile learning here at Florida Tech. I also continued some work with Online Learning including representing Florida Tech at the Florida Virtual Campus (formerly the Florida Distance Learning Consortium). I continue as a member of ACITC.

In these positions, I was responsible for the administration of the distance learning programs. Florida Tech offers a variety of graduate degrees via distance learning including an M. S. in Management, M. S. in Logistics Management, M. S. in Acquisition and Contract Management, and an M. S. in Operations Research to name a few. I was responsible for the technical administration of the programs. Florida Tech used Blackboard as the course management system. I also oversaw the marketing efforts for all the distance learning efforts. We developed an advertising campaign which included a redesign of the distance learning website.

As director of the Virtual Graduate Center, I oversaw admission of students who took their coursework entirely through distance learning. In addition, I oversaw the recruitment of faculty to teach the courses offered through the Virtual Graduate Center. I also served as the point of contact to resolve faculty-student issues. I have been the point of contact for various collaborative efforts include programs with the DAU (Defense Acquisition University) and Boeing Corporation.

In this position, I was responsible for the noncredit programs offered to Continuing Engineering Education's clients. These offerings include the videotape short courses, live teleconferences and Engineering/Management. I was also responsible for all noncredit programs produced and originated by CEE for local, state and national audiences. I was responsible for developing all the marketing effort, working with the presenters on instructional design and production, and identifying and securing new programs. All of the noncredit and production staff reported to me.

In addition, as Interim Director, I had primary responsibility for the establishment of rates, administration of the personnel, and overall administration of the department. The Dean's Office had required that the permanent director of CEE must continue to be an Engineering faculty member. However, because of my experience in CEE, I was asked to serve in this position in order to provide stability for the department for 18 months while the search was being conducted.

As Associate Director, I also assisted with general departmental management as needed. These duties included working with industrial clients for site visits and arranging for new client companies to join the CEE system. I assisted in developing the budget for CEE, which is currently over \$1 million dollars. Other duties in this area are serving as a member of the Industrial Advisory Group and a member of the Committee on Continuing Education in Engineering, the faculty oversight committee for the MSE/MS degrees granted through CEE.

I was the member representative for Purdue to the Association of Media-based Continuing Education for Engineers (AMCEE). I served two years as Chair, Board of Directors. During this time, the Board oversaw the transition of AMCEE from operating under a host-institution model to independent operations. AMCEE is an almost \$.5 million operation. In addition, as the chair of AMCEE, I served for two years as a member of Board of Trustees of the National Technological University (NTU).

I also taught in the Engineering/Management program, most recently teaching a course on team building.
